INTENSIVE, ENGLISH-LANGUAGE PHD WINTER SCHOOL EXPLORING INNOVATIVE AND ETHICAL RESEARCH METHODS FOR ONE HEALTH STUDIES IN MANAGEMENT AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

For PhD students and junior researchers

The **One Health** approach requires us to reconsider the ways in which we study health.

The objective of this seminar is to explore and deepen **methodological approaches in management and the social sciences** that are suited to the intersection of two key dimensions:

1. **The ethics of care** – the concern for care and attention as guiding principles;
2. **Creativity and organisation** particularly in connection with **art** as a way to rethink research approaches.

This **four-day intensive thematic school** will reflect more holistic understanding of health. It will examine how to integrate these two dimensions into research practices, present **innovative projects**, and put these discussions into practice.

The seminar is organized by **LITEM, RITM, LAREQUOI, CPN and IMT-BS** with the support of the **University of Paris-Saclay and the Graduate School Economics & Management**.
